As per the Government Order first read above, the State Government employees were entitled to avail 2 days as Restricted Holidays in a year.

- 2. In the Government letter second read above 29 festivals were notified as restricted holidays.
- 3. The Government now, direct, based on the Government orders third read above, that the State Government employees may avail themselves of holidays not exceeding Three Restricted Holidays in a year on the festivals / occasions from the 'Restricted Holidays' enlisted in the annexure to this Government order at their option and irrespective of the religion to which the festival pertains. Permission to avail oneself of these holidays should be applied for, in writing, in advance and will normally be granted by the superior officers competent to grant casual leave except when the presence of an individual employee is considered necessary in exigencies of Government work. The revised list of festivals for which Restricted Holidays could be availed is annexed to this Government order.
