### **ORDER:**

In the Government order first read above, orders have been issued based on the recommendations of Fourth State Finance Commission stating that 10% of the devolution grant to Rural Local Bodies shall be deducted from the share of Village Panchayats and allocated towards Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund (IGFF) for Village Panchayats and it shall be utilized on project / schemes basis only. Out of the total Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund, 50% shall be allocated towards Tamil Nadu Village Habitations Improvement Scheme (THAI) and from the remaining 50% fund, a part of the amount shall be allocated to the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj and the balance shall be allocated to the Districts based on population and the amount shall be utilized for providing basic amenities in rural areas.

2. In the Government order second read above, orders have been issued for the sanction of a sum of Rs.3645.40 crore to Village Panchayats, Panchayat Unions and District Panchayats as part of the State Finance Commission Grant during 2016-17. In the said order, the Government has earmarked a sum of Rs.534,09,83,000/- for Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund for the year 2016-17 and it has also been informed that the orders on Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund would be issued separately.

3. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj in his letter third read above has requested the orders of the Government to sanction and release a sum of Rs.534,09,83,000/- as Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund from the State Finance Commission Grant for the year 2016-17. He has requested to issue necessary orders

sanctioning the Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund for Rs.93 crore at the rate of Rs.3 crore per District as minimum allocation for the year 2016-17 as was done in 2014-15 and 2015-2016 and the balance amount may be allocated to the District Collectors and the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj in the ratio of 75:25. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has also requested orders of the Government to authorize him to draw and release the above said amount to be released to the District Collectors and to retain the balance amount at State level and to follow the existing guidelines issued in the G.O.(Ms) No.134, Rural Development and Panchayat Raj (PRI) Department, dated 19.9.2013 for utilizing the Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund at District level and State level.

4. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has decided to accept the same. Accordingly the Government accord administrative sanction for a sum of Rs.484,56,63,000/- (Rupees four hundred and eighty four crore fifty six lakhs sixty three thousand only) as Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund from the State Finance Commission Grant for the year 2016-17 as follows:-

5. The Government also order that the existing guidelines for utilizing the Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund (IGFF) vested with the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj and District Collectors issued in the G.O.(Ms) No.134, Rural Development and Panchayat Raj (PR-I) Department, dated 19.09.2013 be followed.

6. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj is authorized to draw a sum of Rs.242,28,31,500/- and disburse the amount to be released to the District Collectors and to retain the balance amount at State level sanctioned in para 4 above.

7. The amount sanctioned in para 4 above shall be debited to the following head of Account:

3604-00-Compensation and Assignments to Local Bodies and Panchayat Raj Institutions- 198 Assistance to Gram Panchayats - AC-Infrastructure Gap Filling Fund for Rural Local Bodies - 09. Grants-in-aid-02-Grants for Creation of Capital Assets (DPC 3604-00-198-AC-0923).
