#### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the infrastructure and basic amenities charges have been collected for the different categories of building and the fund has been maintained by the Director of Town & Country Planning, Chennai and the collected funds shall be utilized for the following purpose.

"As per Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund rule six, the fund may be advanced by the Government as grants, on such terms and conditions as the Government may determine to the planning authorities or the local authorities or the Government agencies or the parastatal organization or such other organizations as the case may be for implementing the infrastructure and amenities projects, which may include,

- a) Preparation of infrastructure investment plans
- Execution of the infrastructure investment plans in full or part,
- Any purpose incidental to the preparation or execution of infrastructure investment plans.

- ii. The fund shall be utilized for translating the proposal of the respective development plans prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Act, into specific programmes.
- iii. Project to be funded from the fund, shall comprise essential infrastructure schemes.
- 2. In the Government Order 2<sup>nd</sup> read above, the list of Peri-Urban Panchayats in Tamil Nadu have also been categorized.
- 3. In the letter 3<sup>rd</sup> read above, the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj based on the above norms, it was proposed to utilise the infrastructure and basic amenities charges to improve the Village Panchayat / Panchayat Union roads, Streets/Lanes in Peri–Urban Panchayats abutting the 21 Municipal corporations including the Chennai Corporation in the first phase. Accordingly, the Government had decided that the funds required for improvement of roads, streets and lanes in Peri-urban village panchayats under Infrastructure has been sourced as follows:-
  - Local Body funds with the Village Panchayats and Panchayat Unions.
  - ii. Funds from Local Planning Authorities for villages in LPA area.
  - iii. Funds from I & A for villages in LPA area and in Non-LPA area.
  - iv. Funds from CMDA for Villages in CMDA area.
- 4. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has sent a proposal to Government to sanction Infrastructure Amenities Fund at a cost of Rs.189.82 crore in 13 districts which were placed before the State Infrastructure and Amenities Promotion Committee meeting held on 14.12.2023 and the committee approved the proposal. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has therefore requested the Government to consider the above proposal and issue necessary orders.
- 5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal for Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj at para 4 above, hereby accords Administrative Sanction for Rs.189,83,00,000 (Rupees One hundred and eighty nine crore eighty three lakhs only) under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund (IAF) for the Year 2024-2025. The district wise proposal under Infrastructure and Amenities Funds is as given below,
