ORDER:

In the letters read above, the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has stated that "Revised Schedule-I of the National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, 2005 Paragraph 4(1)(I) Category-A: Public Works Relating to Natural Resources Management" provides for avenue plantation as provided hereunder: "(v) Afforestation, tree plantation and horticulture in common and forest lands, road margins, canal bunds, tank foreshores and coastal belts duly providing right to usufruct to the households covered in Paragraph 5". In order to provide shade and shelter for people, birds and animals and to increase green cover in rural areas, it is proposed to take up plantation of fruit bearing trees, fodder-based trees and economically valuable trees on either side of roads belonging to Panchayats and Panchayat Unions during the year 2017-18 under MGNREGS. These plantation, apart from preventing soil erosion, will also increase the revenue resources of the Village Panchayats.

2. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has also stated that during the year 2017-18, 20.00 lakh tree saplings will be planted and maintained on either sides of roads belonging to Panchayat, Panchayat Union, and Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana roads to an extent of 10,000 Kms at an estimated cost of Rs.81.90 Crore. Saplings required for Avenue Plantation are available in Block Nurseries of all the 31 districts and the plants from Block Nurseries will be utilized in Avenue Plantation. Plantation activities will include activities such as pitting, planting, provision of Tree Guards, etc. and provision for watering for 1 year. 200 Plants will be planted on both sides of the roads

for the length of 1 Km. at an estimated cost of Rs.0.8189 lakh/Km. Hence, the total estimate cost for 10,000 K.M. will be Rs.81.90 Crore.

Further, the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has stated that the Rural Schedule of Rate approved in G.O.(Ms) No.45, Rural Development and Panchayat Raj (CGS.1) Department, Dated 03.04.2017 shall be adopted. In case of any revision made in Rural Schedule of Rates in future, the same shall be adopted.

4. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has therefore requested the Government to accord permission for undertaking Avenue Plantation on the either sides of roads belonging to Panchayat, Panchayat Union, Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana Roads to an extent of 10,000 Kms at an estimated cost of Rs.81.90 Crore under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, for the year 2017-18 and approve the guidelines therefor.

5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj accord permission for undertaking Avenue Plantation on the either sides of roads belonging to Panchayat, Panchayat Union, PMGSY Roads to an extent of 10,000 Kms at an estimated cost of Rs.81.90 Crore under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, for the year 2017-18 under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme and approve the Guidelines therefor annexed to this order.

6. This order is issued with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No.46208/RD/2017, dated 26.09.2017.

ANNEXURE

Guidelines for Avenue Plantation

[G.O.(Ms).No.129, Rural Development and Panchayat Raj (CGS-1)
Department, dated 10.11.2017]

1. Preparation of estimates:

1. In each block preference should be given for Block Plantation and only in such places where there is no land/site available, Avenue Plantations can be taken up limiting to 1/4th of the total plantation proposed.
2. It should be ensured that 1/3rd of the plantation is done in SC/ST habitations.
3. Each Village Panchayat can have maximum 2 Avenue Plantation estimates.
4. In case of more number of roads are taken in a Village Panchayat, road wise sub-estimates shall be prepared and clubbed to have a maximum of 2 estimates. One estimate should cover the SC/ST areas.
5. The estimate should be prepared for plantation and watering for 1 year with supplementary estimate for 2 years of maintenance (i.e) for the 2nd year and 3rd year.
6. Road wise list of PMGSY roads, Panchayat Union Roads and Village Panchayat roads are taken and among these priority is given to PMGSY roads, then Panchayat Union Roads and then Village Panchayat Roads.

2. General Instructions:

While planning for road side tree plantation, certain restrictions imposed for safety requirement by engineering, traffic system should be followed:

- Trees should be planted at a minimum 0.5 metre beyond the toe of the roadway so that they don't pose / create safety hazard or affect the required sight distance.
- Trees should be planted clear of roadside drains and other drainage structures so that their root system does not interfere with efficient working of the drainage facilities.
- Where there is no sufficient land width available, then the trees could be planted beyond the shoulders keeping in view that the roots do not damage the carriage way and the shoulders.

3. Provisions of Sunken Pits for Moisture Conservation:

- Sunken pits could be dug up in the road side drains wherever feasible to ensure water recharge which will also serve dual purpose of benefitting the plants planted.
- The sunken pits could be dug up in the existing drains with respect to the spacing of plants to a length of 2m and depth of 0.45m keeping the width equal to the existing drain.
- These sunken pits could be included in the estimate as moisture conservation works wherever feasible.
- Saucer pit shall be provided for all the plants.

4. Technical Instructions for taking up Avenue Plantation:

A spacing of 10 m between the plants is to be adopted for Avenue plantation depending on the species. If 10m is adopted as spacing, then the number of plants for 1 Km is 100 on each side, totalling 200 plants on both sides of the road.

- The extent of the road should be measured and where the width is available for plantation alone be taken as the effective length. Sometimes the width may be available for only one side of the road and plantation carried out only on that side. The same has to be specified in the estimate.
- The species suitable to the soil, climate and preference of the villagers/farmers in consultation with the Forest Department should be selected.
- Aligning and marking should be done on the site so that the trees are placed in line with each other.
- The plantation location should be in such a way that,
 1. It should not be placed on belmouth entry of branch roads.
 2. It should not be placed in front of house entry gate, but can be placed on the edge of individual plot.
 3. It should not be placed below the low lying EB line.
- **Tree Guards:** Tree guards are mandatory up to 4ft. height of plants. Any of the following material may be used for as Tree guards for the Avenue Plantation:

- Land development works such as clearance of thorny bushes, weeds at the site should be taken up only if found necessary by adopting RsoR 2017-18 and this should be personally checked out site by the AE / JE concerned.
- Moisture conservation works such as sunken pits shall be provided wherever feasible at places where the plantation level and drainage level is more or less same so as to maintain moisture in the root zone.
- Depending on the number of plants arrived, the component of the pitting, refilling should be included in the estimate.

- Saucer pit shall be provided for all the plants.
- Weeding and hoeing followed by mulching and manuring operation shall be included in the estimate at the rate of twice per year (as per the schedule of maintenance). The technical advice of the departments concerned shall also be obtained in this regard.
- Organic compost or Vermi compost shall be used in the pits before planting the tree saplings. The manure / compost produced through the SWM / Vermi compost units within the Village Panchayats / Blocks may be utilised for plantation activities of their Village Panchayat free of cost.
- Casualty replacement at the rate of 20% maximum during the 2nd year shall be included in the estimate for planting below 1 year old seedlings. The reason for the mortality should be assessed. If the seedlings are raised in Nurseries for one to two years and then planted, the survival rate will be more and the casualty replacement of only 5% maximum should be allowed.
