ORDER:

In the letter read above, the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has stated that the Government of India, Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation have released a sum of Rs.85,88,33,000/- to the Government of Tamil Nadu during the year 2019-20 towards performance based Incentive Grants under Swachh Bharat Mission support operation based on the result of second round of National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS) as detailed below:

2. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has further stated that in Sanction Order Nos.101,102,103/IG/2019-20, dated:14.06.2019 (Ref.No.S-18013/2/2014-O/o Dir.(SBM), the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation has informed that the State Government shall ensure release / transfer of the aforesaid amount to the implementing agency(s) within 15 days of its receipts. Further, the State Water and Sanitation Mission (SWSM) should pass on the substantial portion (more than 95 percent) of the performance based Incentive Grants received from Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation (MDWS) to the appropriate levels of Districts, Blocks, GPs etc. SWSM should pass on incentives to the right level of implementation to provide incentive for sustaining behavior change at the Village Level. Out of Performance based incentive grants of Rs.85.88 crore, a sum of Rs.13.16 crore (Non SCSP and non TSP Rs.9.91crore + SCSP Rs.3.05crore + TSP Rs.0.20 crore) is allocated for DLI-2. The State Water and Sanitation Mission (SWSM) should ensure that the incentive grants received against DLI-2 reaches

the respective Villages, based on the result of second round of National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS) and is spent in accordance with the decision at the Village Level.

3. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has also stated that the incentive funds can be utilized for activities pertaining to sanitation sector, such as making the villages ODF through Individual Household Latrines (IHHLs), Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs), capacity building, Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM) activities including collection, segregation and safe disposal of household garbage, decentralized systems like household composting and biogas plants. The details of the projects / activities undertaken at the State / District / Block / Village level out of incentive grants should be maintained and certify that these grants are utilized only for activities permissible/suggested above. The Projects / activities undertaken should be entered in the Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of SBM(G). The project will be covered by the audit requirements (CAG audit and audit by empanelled Chartered Accountant of the CAG) as provided under the SBM(G) scheme.

4. The Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj has therefore requested the Government to release the Performance based Incentive Grant amount of Rs.85,88,33,000/- (Rupees Eighty five crore eighty eight lakh and thirty three thousand only) received from Government of India towards Performance based Incentive Grants under Swachh Bharat Mission support operation based on the result of 2nd round of National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS) during 2019-20 and authorize the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj to draw and disburse the amount to the District Collectors / Chairpersons, District Rural Development Agencies (DRDAs) based on their requirements as per the guidelines issued by the Government of India.

5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj have decided to accept it and accord sanction for release a sum of Rs.85,88,33,000/- (Rupees Eighty five crore eighty eight lakh and thirty three thousand only) under Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) towards performance based incentive grant for the year 2019-20.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited under the following heads of account:
